

Analysing Global Impact: HUL's Exploration of Project Outcomes at Prabhat Livelihood Centre



Hindustan Unilever Limited (HUL) constructed a team visit to Prabhat Livelihood Centre on November 2nd and 3rd. The primary objectives of the visit were to closely observe the operations of the Prabhat Livelihood Centre, engage with students and provide inspiration and motivation to the Prabhat team for further enhancement of their efforts.

On November 2nd, Mr. Shaibal Chatterjee from Delhi and Ms. Mandira from Mumbai arrived at the center around 11:30 am. Following the reception, they interacted with the students. Ms. Mandira at the classroom, encouraged the students to share their experiences with the lessons, highlight strengths and weaknesses of the center, and offer any suggestions for inclusion in the course curriculum or classroom practices.

After these engaging discussions, Shaibal and Mandira conducted a thorough inspection of the classrooms. Subsequently, they convened with the Prabhat field team to discuss the program. During this session, they put forth valuable suggestions for program's improvement. The following day, on November 3rd, the Prabhat field team ventured to Palri Khurd village at 11:30 am, accompanied by another organisation collaborating with HUL. Upon arrival, the team set up canopies, posters, books, manuals, and student-made models to showcase their work to external visitors. Three female students from the center joined the team to share their learning experiences.

The global HUL team arrived at noon and were welcomed with traditional Haryana culture, presented with 'Pagri' as a sign of respect by the field team. The team inaugurated a pond developed by the 'Parmarth' organisation and planted trees, they then proceeded to visit stalls set up by both organisations.





At 'Parmarth's stall,' a sustainable community model was displayed, illustrating water optimisation and intensive organic farming practices for sustainable agriculture. The team then visited the 'Youth Skill Development Stall,' examining manuals, leaflets and student-made models. The field team elucidated the process of initiating skill development courses, from community mobilisation to post-placement follow-up.

The global team praised the courage of girl students and acknowledged the tireless efforts of the Prabhat team. This insightful and significant visit provided a platform for Prabhat to showcase their impactful work, receive valuable feedback, and reaffirmed their dedication to empowering youth, women, and the community.
